PUBLICATIONS DEVELOPMENT The Clearinghouse produces and distributes healthrelated materials such as directories, information packets, fact sheets, and database searches about human communication disorders. The Clearinghouse also develops new materials to fill information gaps.

THE CLEARINGHOUSE COLLECTS, DEVELOPS, DISSEMINATES INFORMATION, MATERIALS, AND RESOURCES IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

HEARING--normal structure and function of the auditory system; diseases and disorders of the ear including hereditary and other forms of congenital deafness such as Usher syndrome, sudden deafness, noise-induced hearing loss, ototoxicity, presbycusis, tinnitus, otitis media, otosclerosis, and AIDS-related hearing impairment; hearing aids, cochlear implants, vibrotactile aids, assistive devices, and screening methods.

BALANCE--normal structure and function of the vestibular system; disorders and diseases including Meniere's disease, positional vertigo, vestibular neuronitis, and acoustic neurinoma resulting in vertigo, dizziness, and dysequilibrium.

SMELL--normal structure and function of the olfactory system; disorders of smell resulting in anosmia (loss of sense of smell), hyposmia (reduced smell function), and paraosmia (distortion of sense of smell).

NIDCD INFORMATION CLEARINGHOUSE CONTINUES...

TASTE--normal structure and function of the gustatory system; taste disorders resulting in ageusia (loss of sense of taste), hypogeusia (reduced taste function), and dysgeusia (distortion of sense of taste).

VOICE--normal structure and function of the vocal tract; processes of voice production; disorders of the voice such as laryngeal nodules, polyps and neoplasms, contact ulcers, spasmodic dysphonia, vocal tremor, and vocal fold paralysis resulting in hoarseness and weakness of the voice.

SPEECH--normal structure and function of the speech tract; processes of speech production; disorders such as stuttering and neurogenic and developmental speech disorders resulting in dysfluency, dysarthria, and misarticulation; speech of persons who are hearing-impaired; dysphagia; and augmentative and alternative modes of communication.

LANGUAGE--normal processes of language development and production; language disorders such as specific language impairment and aphasia; and language of persons who are deaf.

"Assisted Living Residence" (ALR) means a facility which is licensed by the Department of Health & Senior Services to provide apartment-style housing and congregate dining and to assure that assisted living services are available when needed, for four or more adult persons unrelated to the proprietor. Apartment units offer, at a minimum, one unfurnished room, a private bathroom, a kitchenette, and a lockable door on the unit entrance.

"Comprehensive Personal Care Homes" (CPCHs) provide room and board and provide assisted living services when needed. Residential units in CPCHs can house no more than two residents and have a lockable door on the unit entrance. CPCHs are licensed by the Department of Health and Senior Services.

CONTINUING CARE RETIREMENT COMMUNITIES

A continuing care retirement community (CCRC) provides housing, services and health care (including long-term care) to people of retirement age. The community must provide increasing levels of care beginning with independent living. CCRCs offer a contract that is signed when the person first enters the community. The type of services provided depends upon this contract. There is generally a substantial entrance fee. Monthly fees are also charged. CCRCs are regulated by the NJ Department of Community Affairs. The nursing home facilities are licensed by the NJ Department of Health.

Sheriff's Department

SENIOR & VETERAN SERVICES

Free Home Security Inspections are performed by trained Sheriff's staff to make sure our seniors homes are safe and secure. Free window locks, peep holes, reflective house numbers, smoke & carbon monoxide detectors, security locks and power failure lights are provided when available.

Free Med-Info Packets are provided to seniors to have their complete medical history listed by their family physician. The packet of information is recommended to be placed in the home refrigerator and a program magnet is placed on the frig and sticker on the seniors front door, to alert first responders that this information is available.

Persons-At-Risk Program allows the Burlington County Sheriff's Department to input important emergency information for any senior who may suffer from Alzheimer's, Dementia, Autism or any other disability that may cause them to wander from their home and be unable to return home safely. The information and a photograph provided by the family is entered into the confidential law enforcement records system available to law enforcement & 911 dispatchers.

Project Lifesaver Program provides wristband worn radio transmitters to Persons-At-Risk clients who may wander. The Sheriff's Department is among the 21 Sheriff Depts. in New Jersey who are partners in this valuable program. Should a client be reported missing, the Sheriff or one of our local law enforcement partners in Burlington County will respond with emergency tracking equipment to help the client return home safely.

Senior Police Academy is a 6-week, 1-day per week program that provides seniors with valuable information on crime prevention, consumer fraud, public health issues, fire safety, information on court services and all other senior services provided by the Sheriff's Department. Site visits to the county 9-1 -1 center and police range are included in this informational course.

Veteran ID Cards are provided to any military veteran who has been honorably discharged from any branch of the armed forces. Appointments may be scheduled by calling the Sheriff's Department or by going to the county store at the Moorestown Mall the last Wednesday morning of each month.

Defensive Driving Course is a free 6-hour instructional course to help make drivers safer on the roadway. Participants may be eligible to receive up to a 5% discount and/or a 2-point New Jersey Motor Vehicles reduction. A \$10 fee is required for the National Safety Council certificate.

e: NJ residents age 62 and older or disabled are entitled to a Senior Citizen Pass and free parking at all parks within the New Jersey State Parks Service.

My responsibility as Surrogate is to oversee the administration of the many services offered by this Surrogate's Court. 
