VOTING CORNER

General Election Tuesday, November 2nd

New Jersey has passed legislation to make voting easier, through use of ballot drop boxes.

What is a Ballot drop box? A ballot drop box is a secure, locked structure operated by election officials where voters may deliver



their ballots from the time they receive them in the mail up to the time polls close at 8 pm on Election Day, November 2, 2021. There will be at least 10 drop boxes located throughout each county, which will be available 24 hours a day. A drop box has been installed in Eastampton at 12 Manor House Court, and additional Burlington County locations can be found at:

Here are the 3 ways you can vote in the upcoming General Election...

1. VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT



Registered voters can apply for a vote-by-mail ballot by following the instructions found at VOTE.NJ.GOV or contacting their County Clerk.

Then, VOTE and RETURN your ballot one of the following ways...

- Mail: Your vote-by-mail ballot MUST be postmarked on or before 8:00 p.m. November 2 and be received by your county's Board of Elections on or before November 8.
- Secure Ballot Drop Box: Place your vote-by-mail ballot in one of your county's secure ballot drop boxes by 8:00 p.m. on November 2. Drop box locations can be found at VOTE.NJ.GOV.
- · Board of Elections Office: Deliver your vote-by-mail ballot in person to your county's Board of Elections Office by 8:00 p.m. on November 2. County Election Officials' contact information can be found at VOTE.NJ.GOV.

2. IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING



This new option enables all registered voters to cast their ballot in person, using a voting machine, during a nine-day period prior to Election Day. You can now choose to vote, in person, when it's most convenient for your schedule.

No matter where you live in the county, you can vote your specific ballot at any of your county's designated in-person early voting locations. Find your county's locations at VOTE.NJ.GOV.

In-person early voting locations will be open Saturday, October 23 through Sunday, October 31. Hours will be Monday-Saturday, 10:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. and Sunday, 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. No appointment is necessary. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities.

3. AT YOUR POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY



Vote in person at your polling place, from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, November 2. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities.

Go to **VOTE.NJ.GOV** for your polling place, listed on the Polling Locations page.

NOTE: Vote-by-mail ballots CANNOT be returned to your early voting location or polling place.

TAX COLLECTORS CORNER



LICENSING CORNER

Dog Licensing will be completely online beginning January 1, 2022. Beginning with the 2022 licensing you can fully license your fur baby electronically! You may still license your dog in person at the Manor House with a paper application, or through the mail or Drop Box with a self-addressed stamped envelope.



Our cloud-based platform GovPilot is currently used for Certificate of Continued Occupancy (CCO) for rentals/resales, Business Registrations, Landlord Registrations, Report A Concern, and a GIS Map of Eastampton. Dog Licensing will be the newest addition.

Single Use Plastic Laws

A provision of New Jersey's commitment to reduce plastics pollution statewide will take effect on **Thursday**, **Nov. 4** when food-service businesses may provide single-use plastic straws to a customer **only upon request**. For more information you may view the press release <u>here</u>.

Governor Murphy also signed legislation that will go into effect in May 2022 prohibiting the use of single-use plastic and paper bags and disposable food containers and cups made from polystyrene foam in all stores and food service businesses. For further details please go to the following:
