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HOLIDAY CORNER

Municipal Offices are closed on Monday, July 4th in Observance of Independence Day. We will reopen on Tuesday, July 5th at 8:30 a.m.

As we approach the **July 4th** holiday weekend, we wanted to send out a message to our residents in regards to fireworks. We encourage the residents of Eastampton Township to enjoy the holiday weekend in a responsible way while celebrating and spending time together. We understand that some will take it upon themselves to engage in setting off fireworks at their own residences.

We would like to remind everyone of **Township Ordinance 343-1**. It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue or cause to be made or continued any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others within the limits of the Township. Respectfully, **Title 21** (Explosives and Fireworks) of **New Jersey State Code**, specifically **21:2-6** Dangerous fireworks prohibited, states: it shall be unlawful to manufacture, sell, transport, or use dangerous fireworks within the state. "Dangerous fireworks" include:

- Toy torpedoes containing more than 5 grains of an explosive composition.
- Paper caps containing more than .35 grain of explosive composition.
- Firecrackers or salutes exceeding 5 inches in length or 3/4 inch in diameter.
- Cannons, canes, pistols or other devices designed for use otherwise than with paper caps.
- Any fireworks containing a compound or mixture of yellow or white phosphorous or mercury.
- Any fireworks that contain a detonator or blasting cap.
- Fireworks compositions that ignite spontaneously or undergo marked decomposition when subjected for 48 consecutive hours to a temperature of 167 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Fireworks that can be exploded en masse by a blasting cap placed in one of the units or by impact of a rifle bullet or otherwise.
- Fireworks, such as fuses, containing a match tip, or head, or similar igniting point or surface, unless each individual tip, head or igniting point or surface is thoroughly covered and securely protected from accidental contact or friction with any other surface.
- Fireworks containing an ammonium salt and a chlorate.

We ask that everyone please be considerate of your fellow neighbors and their animals. Many residents have young children and animals that may become anxious and frightened at the sound of fireworks. Please also remember that fireworks are dangerous explosive devices that can lead to severe injuries and even lead to death. On behalf of the Township of Eastampton we wish you a happy and healthy 4th of July. Please enjoy it responsibly!

IMPROVEMENTS CORNER



Earle Asphalt Company has been contracted by Eastampton Township for the 2022 Road Improvements Program to Knightsbridge Road and various other roads including: Darby Circle East and West, Oxford Court, Berwick Court, Stafford Court, Bedford Court, Suffolk Court, York Court, Prince William Court, Jennifer Court, Rochelle Drive, Ariel Drive, Liat Drive, Christopher Lane, Woodhurst Drive, Honey Locust Lane, Dewberry Drive, Jessica Way, Parkview Drive, Lakeview Terrace, Juniper Street, Carol Court, Hampton Drive, Shelter Rock Road, Cedar Mill Lane, Butternut Court, Knotty Oak Drive, Cedarwood Court, Woodstone Court, and Woodhurst Court.

Work will take place during the hours of **7am-5pm**. The contractor is responsible for notifying all residents within 48 hours prior to construction, and if construction is delayed a new notice will be given out.

During hours of construction, please be advised traffic will be limited. Thru traffic to all homes/businesses will be available, although there will be no direct parking in the designated construction areas. Please follow all signage while operating your vehicle, and use complete caution while walking and driving through all work areas.

The contractor is required by law to call for utility mark-outs prior to the start of construction. Property owners are strongly encouraged to notify Earle of any underground sprinkler systems, underground dog fencing or any other utility that may be unique to your property and not covered by utility mark-outs prior to the start of construction.

The anticipated date for project completion is prior to the first day of the 2023 school year. Please note all work will be done with weather permitting, and each day work is canceled due to weather will result in a delay to the schedule.

RESIDENT CORNER

Resident Reminder. We need everyone's cooperation to help keep Eastampton neat and tidy. Please adhere to the schedule for your area for brush or bulk pick-up. Anything is to be placed out only on the night before your scheduled pickup day.

Ordinance 2019-17. 444-2 Section D.

The Township will collect bulk trash on a monthly basis. Bulk shall consist of items such as old furniture, bedding, carpeting, pool covers and metal items such as bicycles. No waste materials of any kind that are generated from commercial activities or businesses, including handyman, repair services, retail store, offices, real estate agencies, landlords, contractors, agricultural enterprises. Residents doing minor repairs to the primary residence may put out small amounts of debris on their bulk day. No house/rental clean outs will be accepted.


