

#### VOTING CORNER

The last day to register to vote for the General Election on Tuesday, November 8, 2022 is on **Tuesday, October 18**, **2022**. Visit the NJ Voter Information Portal to check your registration status, or fill out your voter registration application online at NJ DOS - Division of Elections - Register to Vote! (state.nj.us).

In-person early voting allows registered voters to cast their ballot in person, using a voting machine, during the designated voting period prior to Election Day. You can now choose to vote, in person, when it's most convenient for your schedule. The in-person early voting period is October 29<sup>th</sup> -November 6<sup>th</sup>. Hours will be Monday-Saturday, 10:00 a.m. -8:00 p.m. and Sunday, 10:00 a.m. -6:00 p.m. No appointment is necessary. *The designated locations have not been posted by the NJ Division of Elections at the time of this publication.* For further information visit New Jersey Department of State - Division of Elections - NJ Voter Information Portal to reach the New Jersey Voter Information Portal, or call 1-877-NJ-VOTER (1-877-658-6837) with any voting questions.



#### Top 5 Things To Know About In-Person Early Voting

Here are the answers to five common questions about in-person early voting for the General Election:

#### 1. WHAT IS IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING?

This option enables all registered voters to cast their ballot in person, using a voting machine, during a nine-day period prior to Election Day. You can choose to vote, in person, when it's most convenient for your schedule.

#### 2. WHERE CAN I ACCESS IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING?

- No matter where you live in the county, you can vote your specific ballot at any of your county's designated in-person early voting locations.
- Find your county's locations at VOTE.NJ.GOV.

#### 3. WHEN CAN I ACCESS IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING?

- In-person early voting locations will be open Saturday, October 29 through Sunday, November 6.
- Hours will be Monday-Saturday, 10:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. and Sunday, 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. No appointment is necessary. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities.

#### 4. WHAT IF I ALWAYS VOTE BY MAIL, BUT NOW WANT TO VOTE EARLY, IN PERSON, INSTEAD?

• If you are registered to vote by mail in the 2022 General Election, you may cast your ballot during early, in-person voting or on election day via a provisional ballot which will be provided to you at your early voting location or polling place. Learn more about provisional ballots at VOTE.NJ.GOV.

#### 5. CAN I STILL CHOOSE FROM OTHER VOTING OPTIONS?

Yes. You may select, instead, to:

- Apply for a vote-by-mail ballot and return it one of the following ways...
  - 1... Mail: It must be postmarked on or before 8:00 p.m. November 8 and be received by your county's Board of Elections on or before November 14.
  - 2... Secure Ballot Drop Box: Place it in one of your county's secure ballot drop boxes by 8:00 p.m. on November 8. Drop box locations can be found at VOTE.NJ.GOV.
  - 3... Board of Elections Office: Deliver it in person to your county's Board of Elections Office by 8:00 p.m. on November 8. County Election Officials' contact information can be found at VOTE.NJ.GOV.
- Or, vote in person at your polling place, from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, November 8. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities. Go to VOTE.NJ.GOV for your polling place, listed on the Polling Locations page.



#### Here are the 3 ways you can vote in the upcoming General Election...

#### 1. VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT



Registered voters can apply for a vote-by-mail ballot by following the instructions found at VOTE.NJ.GOV or contacting their County Clerk.

Then, VOTE and RETURN your ballot one of the following ways...

- Mail: Your vote-by-mail ballot MUST be postmarked on or before 8:00 p.m. on November 8 and be received by your county's Board of Elections on or before November 14.
- Secure Ballot Drop Box: Place your vote-by-mail ballot in one of your county's secure ballot drop boxes by 8:00 p.m. on November 8. Drop box locations can be found at VOTE.NJ.GOV.
- Board of Elections Office: Deliver your vote-by-mail ballot in person to your county's Board of Elections Office by 8:00 p.m. on November 8. County Election Officials' contact information can be found at VOTE.NJ.GOV.

#### 2. IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING



This option enables all registered voters to cast their ballot in person, using a voting machine, during a nine-day period prior to Election Day. You can choose to vote, in person, when it's most convenient for your schedule.

No matter where you live in the county, you can vote your specific ballot at any of your county's designated in-person early voting locations. Find your county's locations at VOTE.NJ.GOV.

Vote in person at your polling place, from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, November 8. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities.






