

WHEREAS, Ryan Stutzenburg of the Boy Scouts of America, Troop 32, has progressed through the ranks of Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts and has progressed to earn the rank of "Eagle Scout", scouting's highest award; and

WHEREAS, Ryan Stutzenburg has been an active scout demonstrating outstanding leadership, and has contributed many community service hours during his years of scouting; and

WHEREAS, to achieve the rank of Eagle Scout, a scout must have a minimum of twenty-two months tenure, have earned at least seven skill awards, logged a minimum of eighteen hours community service time, served at least sixteen months as a troop leader in three of eleven leadership positions, and have amassed at least twenty-one merit badges (eleven of which are required by the Boy Scouts of America National Committee); and

WHEREAS, Ryan Stutzenburg's Eagle Scout candidate service project involved the construction of a retaining wall around the sign at the Mt. Holly Moose Lodge, along with rebuilding and repainting the lengthy fence across the front; and

WHEREAS, before receiving final approval for the rank of Eagle Scout, a scout's achievements must be reviewed and approved by the Board of Review with the Council District Advancement Chairman and if approved by said Board, then all paperwork is sent to the National Headquarters in Texas for approval. All of these requirements must be completed prior to a scout's 18th birthday.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that I, Robert Apgar, Mayor of the Township of Eastampton, in the County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, on behalf of myself and the Township Council congratulate Ryan Stutzenburg for achieving this accomplishment, which symbolizes the American ideal of good citizenship.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Township Council wishes Ryan Stutzenburg much success in all his future endeavors.

RECYCLING



Household Battery Recycling. Do Not Recycle Alkaline Batteries, such as AA, C, D, or 9 Volt. Put them in your household trash. Rechargeable batteries come in the same sizes and are used for laptops and toys. Rechargeable batteries include Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd), Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) and Small Sealed Lead Acid (SSLA/Pb). Recycle these at Home Depot, Lowes, Staples and other locations listed at www.Call2Recycle.org.

*Never put batteries in your recycling! Batteries have caused fires at recycling centers!



DOG LICENSING

Residents Are Reminded That All Dogs over 6 Months of Age Are Required to be Licensed Each Year. Dog licenses are valid for the current calendar year, and expire annually on December 31. Dog Licensing for 2024 begins on January 1st and the cost for the months of January and February is \$10.00 for a neutered/spayed dog, and \$13.00 for a non-neutered/spayed dog. A

\$10.00 additional fee will be assessed for each dog beginning on March 1st as per Ordinance 2021-5. In addition to online payments, you can also drop off or mail your dog license application and payment along with a self-addressed stamped envelope at 12 Manor House Court to receive your license by mail.

Please note that the **rabies vaccination must be valid through November 1, 2024 by NJ State law** to obtain the dog license. It is recommended to_review your dog's rabies vaccination expiration date now to avoid any delays in your 2024 licensing.

Animal Control personnel are permitted to inspect current licenses for all dogs residing within the Township. Licensing information may be obtained by calling (609) 267-5723 ext. 200.

SPECIAL NEEDS REGISTRATION

The Eastampton Police Department is seeking voluntary emergency contact information for any person (of any age) that are affected by any form of altered mental status including *Autism*, *Dementia*, *Bi-Polar Disorder*, *Schizophrenia*, or other illness, condition, or "Special Need" that may cause them to become impaired.

Police Officers receive specific training to follow protocols when they contact persons with "Special Needs". It would greatly help if The Eastampton Police Department was able to understand who the person is prior to making contact. This prior knowledge will aid in better communication which will lead to a safer resolution for all involved parties.

"Please be advised that New Jersey's Open Public Records Act defines information sent to a public agency as a public record and makes public records subject to public disclosure. New Jersey does exempt from disclosure any "information relating to medical, psychiatric or psychological history, diagnosis, treatment or evaluation." So it is the Township's opinion that any information submitted here will be exempt from public disclosure, and the Township will not release this information, however please be advised that the Government Records Council and the Superior Court are the only parties with final authority to determine whether a public record must be released."

The Eastampton Police Department can enter specifics such as:

- Noise, Sound, Touch sensitivities
- Medication they may be taking
- Places they frequent
- Topics to easily discuss to put the individual at ease

Furthermore, after the individual's needs are registered (go to <u>Eastampton Township</u>, <u>NJ Online Application Forms (govpilot.com)</u>), they will be provided with an Identification Card, which if kept on their person, can assist an Officer in identifying the individual or contacting a family member/guardian.



LEAF COLLECTION. Residents, please rake leaves and place in the grass strip between the curb and sidewalk for collection. Leaves should not be placed in the street or near fire hydrants, sign posts, portable basketball hoops, or telephone poles. Leaves must be free of all trash, sticks, branches, vines, rocks, dirt, and debris. **Mixed material**

will not be collected. Additional information, including your areas scheduled collection week, can be found at our website www.eastampton.com.

BRUSH COLLECTION

During the months of December through March <u>brush will not be collected</u>. Do not put any brush out for collection during these winter months, or you will receive a letter to remove, followed by a Notice of Violation. If you have brush that needs disposal of you may take it to the Burlington County Resource Recovery Complex located at 2000 Burlington Columbus Rd. Columbus, NJ 08022.
