# TAX COLLECTORS CORNER

The first quarter property tax payment is due on February 1<sup>st</sup>, and there is a 10-day grace period. Payments made after the close of business on February 10<sup>th</sup> will accrue interest dating back to the original due date. **Eastampton Township Accepts Online Tax Payments.** Residents can make payments online via ACH, e-check, credit card or

debit card by visiting <u>WIPP (edmundsassoc.com</u>). An administrative fee will be assessed by the company processing the transactions.

## DOG LICENSING

Residents Are Reminded That All Dogs over 7 Months of Age Are Required to be Licensed Each Year.

Dog licensing began on January 1, 2023. Please go to <u>Dog Licensing | Eastampton</u> <u>New Jersey</u> to completely license your dog from the warmth of your home, at any time!

The cost for the month of February is \$10.00 for a neutered/spayed dog and \$13.00 for a non-neutered/spayed dog.

A <u>\$10.00 additional fee will be assessed for each dog beginning on March 1, 2023</u> as per Ordinance 2021-5. Please ensure your dog's rabies vaccination does not expire before November 1, 2023 or the dog license cannot be issued as per NJ state law.

<u>Animal Control personnel are permitted to inspect current licenses for all dogs</u> <u>residing within the Township</u>. Introduced: March 8, 2021 Adopted: March 22, 2021

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2021-5**

#### TOWNSHIP OF EASTAMPTON BURLINGTON COUNTY AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 145-14 (D) OF THE EASTAMPTON TOWNSHIP CODE REGARDING FEES; RENEWAL AND EXPIRATION

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of Eastampton, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey, as follows:

#### SECTION I.

The Township Council hereby amends Chapter 145-14 (D) of the Township Code regarding "Fees; Renewal and Expiration" to now read as follows:

#### **Chapter 145-14 (D)**

D. In the event that a person required to apply for a dog license by this article fails to apply for said dog license by March 1<sup>st</sup> of any year, the person shall pay a late fee of \$10.00 for each month that the license is not obtained. Said late fee to be cumulative and to be charged after the first day of the month, for that month, regardless of when the license is obtained during the month of obtaining the license.

#### **SECTION II. Repealer, Severability and Effective Date.**

- 1. **Repealer.** Any and all Ordinances inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of any such inconsistencies.
- 2. Severability. In the event that any clause, section, paragraph or sentence of this Ordinance is deemed to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, then the Township Council hereby declares its intent that the balance of the Ordinance not affected by said invalidity shall remain in full force and effect to the extent that it allows the Township to meet the goals of the Ordinance.
- 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect on March 1, 2022 and upon proper passage in accordance with the law.

#### **RESIDENT CORNER**

**Resident Reminder.** We need everyone's cooperation to help keep Eastampton neat and tidy. Please adhere to the schedule for your area for bulk pick-up. Anything is to be placed out only after 6pm on the Thursday night before your scheduled pickup day.

#### Ordinance 2019-17. 444-2 Section D.

The Township will collect bulk trash on a monthly basis. Bulk shall consist of items such as old furniture, bedding, carpeting, pool covers and metal items such as bicycles. No waste materials of any kind that are generated from commercial activities or businesses, including handyman, repair services, retail store, offices, real estate agencies, landlords, contractors, agricultural enterprises. Residents doing minor repairs to the primary residence may put out small amounts of debris on their bulk day. No house/rental clean outs will be accepted.



Bulky waste consists of items such as old furniture, bedding, carpeting, pool covers and metal items such as bicycles. No waste materials of any kind that are generated from commercial activities or businesses, including handyman, repair services, retail store, offices, real estate agencies, landlords, contractors, agricultural enterprises will be accepted.

Residents doing minor repairs to the primary residence may put out small amounts of debris on their bulk day.

Please do not place any items out for collection prior to 6:00 pm the Thursday evening before your scheduled bulk pickup day.

If a building permit was required for the work that generated waste then it is considered construction debris. Absolutely no contractors or landlords will be permitted to dispose of construction or demolition debris.

Public Works does not collect tires or Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) such as paint, cleaners, oils, batteries and pesticides. **BRUSH COLLECTION.** During the months of December through March **brush will not be collected. Do not put any brush out for collection** during these winter months, or you will receive a letter to remove, followed by a Notice of Violation. If you have brush that needs disposal of you may take it to the Burlington County Resource Recovery Complex located at 2000 Burlington Columbus Rd. Columbus, NJ 08022. ## HOLLYVILLE PARK

Eastampton Township applied for and was awarded a grant in the amount of \$90,000.00 through the Burlington County Municipal Park Development Program. The Township included matching funds of \$90,000 in its bond ordinance in 2022. Residents were invited to complete a survey regarding Hollyville Park improvements, which were provided to our Township Engineer. This assisted the Engineer in drafting a concept plan that includes new playground equipment, additional parking and other park improvements. On January 25, 2023 the Public Works Department removed the existing playground equipment and installed temporary fencing. The Township will apply for another grant to secure additional funding, and any updates will be posted in future newsletters.
