Deputy Mayor Dominic F. Santillo

Dominic has been a resident of Eastampton Township since 2013, residing in Eastampton Meadows (Farms). Since moving to town, he has been a member of the Eastampton Community School Superintendent search committee (2016) and was appointed as a member of the Eastampton Land Use Planning Board in January 2018. Dominic is also a member of the Sons of the American Legion, Mount Holly Post #11.

Dominic and his wife of sixteen years, Elizabeth, met at The College of New Jersey. They previously lived together in Bordentown and Willingboro before settling down in Eastampton with their three children: Dominic Jr (14), Kaitlyn (12) and David (9). Beth is a school teacher in the Bordentown Regional School District.

Dominic is employed by Christiana Care Health System in Newark, DE as an Information Services Process Manager. He has worked at Christiana Care for nearly 10 years and currently serves as IT Service Management Incident Manager. Previous healthcare IT experience includes time served at Kennedy Health System in Cherry Hill and as a vendor consultant traveling across the US implementing emergency department software.

Dominic was admitted to The College of New Jersey (TCNJ) and participated in Student Government and other activities while attaining a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with a Specialization in Information Systems Management. After graduation, he spent time in the restaurant industry as a server, bartender and banquet manager until finding a position to leverage his IT skills.

Raised in Garfield, NJ (Bergen County) where he attended public school for grades K-12, in his junior year of high school Dominic was selected to attend the American Legion Jersey Boys State ("ALJBS") program. Held at Rider University the week-long, hands-on leadership seminar on civics and government, Dominic served as "mayor" of his Boys State city.

He returned to be a member of the all-volunteer staff the following year and served for 24 years before stepping aside in 2022. In addition, he also was selected as a Trustee of the New Jersey Boys State Foundation - the fundraising organization associated with the program. He currently serves as Secretary for the Board of Trustees; he previously served 14 years as Chairman.

Dominic was elected to Township Council in November 2018, and November 2022. Dominic represents the Township Council on the Land Use Planning Board and will serve as Deputy Mayor in 2023. Previously, he served as Deputy Mayor in 2020 and Mayor in 2021.

Council Member Ricardo J. Rodriguez Ricardo has been a resident of Eastampton Township (Eastampton Farms and Eastampton Village) since 1998. Ricardo and his wife Ziebell have three children, Jeancarlo, Carlos, and Alexander, all which attended the Eastampton Community School.

Ricardo graduated from the Inter American University of Puerto Rico with a Bachelor of Science and from the New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT) with a Master of Science, both in Computer Science.

Ricardo previously served in the United States Air Force and was stationed at McGuire Air Force Base. He was honorably discharged from the Air Force, and has since been employed by Department of Defense

Ricardo was active for many years in the community as a volunteer coach for Sacred Heart CYO baseball, coaching his children's youth baseball teams.

He has served and represented the Township Council on various boards and committees since 2009, including the Economic Development Advisory Committee and the Land Use Planning Board, both of which he was appointed as Chairperson.

Ricardo has also previously served as a member of the Township Council (2010-2014), elected as Deputy Mayor and Mayor of Eastampton Township.

Council Member Jay Springer

Jay has been a resident of Eastampton Township since 1991. For 10 years he lived in Eastampton Mews and served as President on the board of the Eastampton Mews Homeowners Association. In 2001 he and his family moved to the Lakeview section of town. Prior to his election to Eastampton Township Council, he was active on the Township's Environmental Commission and was Vice Chair of the Township's Land Use Planning Board.

Jay and Kim, his wife of 33 years, have two adult children, Joshua and Jenna, who both attended the Eastampton Community School. Jay has been very active in the community for many years. He coached youth baseball and softball and volunteered much of his time in support of the performing arts programs at Rancocas Valley Regional High School. He also served as a Chief Steward with the Communications Workers of America Local 1036 and is a New Jersey AFL-CIO endorsed labor candidate.



For 34 years Jay was employed as an environmental professional at the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection with a diverse background in several clean water programs working on initiatives such as watershed restoration, sustainability and controlling water pollution. He also represented the State of New Jersey on the federal Delaware Estuary Program, working with partners from around the region in the corporate, public and non-profit sectors. Jay left the DEP in 2021 and is currently Director at the Burlington County Bridge Commission.

He attended Rowan University, where he met his wife Kim and received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Biology in 1988. In 2017, he earned a Certified Public Manager (CPM) from the Rutgers University School of Public Affairs and Administration. He has also been an Instructor at Rutgers University teaching Continuing Professional Education courses on Wetlands, Stormwater and Floodplain Management and has been a guest speaker on environmental issues at classes and seminars at the University of Pennsylvania, Yale University, Montclair State University, Stevens Institute of Technology and at several environmental, professional, and governmental organization events.

Jay was first elected to Township Council in 2008 and served as Deputy Mayor in 2009 and 2019; and as Mayor in 2010 and 2017. He currently represents Township Council on the Environmental Advisory Committee and has previously represented the Township Council on the Land Use Planning Board and Economic Development Advisory Committee.



Council Member Anthony Zeno

Anthony has been a resident of Eastampton Township since 2008. He lives in Carriage Park with his wife Michelle and 2 of his 4 children, Dominique (student at Penn State University) and Michael (student at RVRHS). Anthony Jr. now resides in Medford with his wife Ali and their son Vincent. Angela resides in Columbus with her husband Isaac and their three children, Gabriella, Anthony and Alaina.

Anthony has been employed since 1984 by the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local 456. He attended Middlesex County College for 2 years, followed by a 5 year Apprenticeship at MCVTS, graduating

Anthony has been the Electrical General Foreman on various large projects throughout New Jersey and is currently working with PSE&G and other utility companies updating the electrical infrastructure throughout the Mid-Atlantic region. DOG LICENSING

Residents Are Reminded That All Dogs over 7 Months of Age Are Required to be Licensed Each Year. Dog licenses are valid for the current calendar year, and expire annually on December $31^{\rm st}$.

Dog Licensing began on January $1^{\rm st}$ and the cost for the months of January and February is \$10.00

for a neutered/spayed dog, and \$13.00 for a non-neutered or non-spayed dog. A **\$10.00 additional fee** will be assessed for each dog **beginning on March 1**st as per Ordinance 2021-5.

In addition to online payments you can also drop off or mail your dog license application and payment **along with a self-addressed stamped envelope** to 12 Manor House Court to receive your license by mail.

Please note that the rabies vaccination must be valid through November 1, 2023 by NJ State Law to obtain the dog license.

Animal Control personnel are permitted to inspect current licenses for all dogs residing within the Township. Licensing information may be obtained by calling (609) 267-5723 ext. 200.

There will be a **FREE Rabies Clinic** at the Burlington County Animal Shelter located at 35 Academy Drive in Westampton **on Wednesday, January 25th from 3:00-4:00 pm.**

CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION. The Department of Public Works collects Christmas trees **beginning on January 9, 2023**. Trees should be placed curbside for collection, and all lights, decorations and tree stand must be removed. Live, artificial, or trees which are chemically treated or "flocked" will be collected on an as needed basis. - Eastampton Township reserves the right to cancel this permit for any date needed for a Township event.
- Any applicant violating the rules and regulations could cause permit to be re-evaluated or revoked and/or Security Deposit to be withheld.

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

Scalehouse - Before entering the Complex, everyone must report to the scalehouse where you will be directed to:

Convenience Center - For small truck or car loads of waste to be manually unloaded into marked containers.

Computer/Television Dropoff -

Residents may bring computers/ laptops, monitors, TVs, keyboards/ mice/cables, printers, desktop printers/ copiers, scanners, fax machines, radio/ stereos (*no speakers*), VCR/DVD players, cameras, cell phones, telephones. No loose batteries or loose toner cartridges. Small businesses (*50 employees or less*) located in Burlington County must call (609) 499-1001 for approval.

Other Recycling Options - Check

your municipality to see if they have a local ewaste dropoff or visit Goodwill donation centers, which accept nonworking TVs and monitors for recycling.

Drywall (sheetrock) - Must be clean, dry, unpainted drywall from new construction. HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITY (HHWF)

For residential hazardous waste such as paint, solvents, pesticides, weed killers, pool and photo chemicals, fluorescent lights, ballasts and small fire extinguishers.

HHWF HOURS OPEN:

Tuesday to Friday: 7am - 3pm Saturday: 7am - Noon Proof of county residency required

CLOSED ON MONDAYS

If a holiday falls on Monday, the facility will be closed on Tuesday.

Batteries - Rechargeable, lead acid, button, lithium batteries, especially laptop batteries, should NEVER be put in trash or recycling; they can cause fires.

Recycle at most stores that sell them or bring to HHWF. *Note: alkaline batteries are not hazardous and may be safely placed in the trash.*

Compact Fluorescent Bulbs (CFLs) -

CFLs contain mercury; bring unbroken bulbs to the HHWF for safe disposal. The Home Depot and Lowes accept CFLs for recycling. They do not accept

CLLs for recycling. They do not accept the long tube types of fluorescent lights. Take tube lights to the Household Hazardous Waste Lacility for safe disposal. For info. on broken CFLs visit:
