For the first time in several years we are growing. Preschool has certainly helped increase our population. To that end we are hiring several teachers to meet the needs of our growing school. As many of you know already, we are expanding to a fourth preschool classroom and now will be opening a fourth kindergarten classroom as well. This will help keep our class sizes low so our teachers can continue to meet the needs of all the students in their care. There has been an increase in [Harrassment, Intimidation and Bullying \(HIB\)](#) reports over the last several months. - **Kindergarten 2023-2024**

We are attempting to locate children who are eligible for kindergarten for the 2023-2024 school year.
