Primary Election

Tuesday, <u>June 16, 2020</u> is the deadline for registering to vote in time for the <u>July 7th</u> Primary Election. Residents can check their voter registration status online by using the "Registration Resources" link on the County Clerk's Burlington County Clerk's website page.

Reminder, residents who are currently age 17 can sign up now to automatically register to vote when you turn 18. Seventeen year olds who sign up for automatic registration on or before June 16th, and who will turn 18 by July7th, are eligible to participate in the Primary Election.
