Mosquito Notifications

This is to inform you that you can sign up for notifications to the Burlington County Mosquito Control calendar. The calendar will be updated as to when we will be spraying with the helicopter in your township as well as when we will be performing adulticides (spraying for adult mosquitoes) with the truck driving through the area fogging. Most notifications will be at least 24 hours before the treatments but in an emergency, this could be shorter. Once you are signed up for the notifications you will receive an email when we update the calendar with an event.

The instructions to sign up for the calendar updates can also be given out to the public if they want to be notified individually.

To sign up:

- Go to the Burlington County Website at www.co.burlington.nj.us
- Hover over the **How Do I** in the top menu
- When the menu opens there is a title on the right side that says Sign Up, under that click on Notify Me
- Next enter your email and scroll down to the calendars heading and make sure to check next to the **Mosquito Spraying** calendar

You should now be signed up for the notifications for mosquito spraying.
