Due dates will be extended in accordance to State statute, which allows 25 days from the date of bulk mailing. *The extension date listed on the bills is* **September 7, 2021**. Please Keep Grass Clippings Out of the Street. Residents and landscapers are reminded to keep grass clippings out of the street and the Township's storm drains. Blowing grass and other yard debris into the sidewalk, street, or storm drainage system is a violation of the Township's littering and storm water ordinances.

Grass clippings, leaves, and other lawn debris can clog storm drains, resulting in street and private property flooding. Also, storm drains flow directly to local waterways untreated. Grass clippings add unnecessary nutrients, which help feed harmful algal blooms. In addition to environmental harm, you may be creating a safety hazard. When blown into the street, clippings can create a slippery and dangerous surface for traveling motorcyclists and bicyclists.

Using a mulching mower puts clippings back into the turf and keeps the nutrients where they belong. Should you choose to use a discharging mower, please be sure to point the blower toward your property (away from the street) to prevent clippings from leaving the lawn. When finished mowing, please be sure to use a blower, broom, or rake to clean up any grass clippings or debris that have inadvertently made their way into the street, sidewalk, or storm drain. We appreciate your cooperation.

Resident Reminder. The Tree & Branch Ordinance, Chapter 330-12,

Responsibility of commercial establishments and residences, states: "It shall be the duty of the owner, lessee, tenant, occupant or person in charge of any structure to keep and cause to be kept the sidewalk and curb abutting the building or structure free from obstruction or nuisances of every kind, and to keep sidewalks, areaways, backyards, courts and alleys free from litter and other offensive material.

latest recycling updates on shredding events, schedule changes due to inclement weather and more with the free <u>Recycle Coach</u> smartphone application. The latest update shows that 24% of Eastampton residents use Recycle Coach as a way to learn what to recycle and report problems. That is almost double the number of residents that were using the app at this time last year. Our community is one of the top municipalities using this tool, and is above the County average of 18%. Great job Eastampton residents!

Burlington County Reminds Residents That Hazardous Waste is Banned from Landfills. Household hazardous waste (HHW) is leftover household products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable, or reactive ingredients such as paints, cleaners, oils, batteries and pesticides. Improper disposal of these wastes can pollute the environment and pose a threat to human health. In an effort to remove HHW from the municipal solid waste stream and keep it out of the Burlington County Landfill, the County commenced operation of a permanent collection facility in 1994. This facility is open year round, and Burlington County residents do not need to make an appointment, but must provide proof of residency.

Please note that materials will only be accepted during operating hours, **Tuesday thru Friday 7 am-3pm**, and **Saturday 7am-12pm**. *If a holiday falls on a Monday the facility will be closed on Tuesday as well*. 
Go directly to the scalehouse; from there you will be directed to the electronics recycling area.

"No Knock" Solicitation. The Township recognized the need to license and regulate peddlers and solicitors who are conducting business within the Township. The Township also sought to prevent peddlers and solicitors from accessing homes of residents that do not wish to be disturbed through **Ordinance 2019-20**. *Chapter 374* of the Township Code amended the license fee for peddlers and solicitors in Eastampton, and established a "No-Knock" list for residents. Bulky waste consists of items such as old furniture, bedding, carpeting, pool covers and metal items such as bicycles. No waste materials of any kind that are generated from commercial activities or businesses, including handyman, repair services, retail store, offices, real estate agencies, landlords, contractors, agricultural enterprises.

Residents doing minor repairs to the primary residence may put out small amounts of debris on their bulk day.

Please do not place any items out for collection prior to 6:00 pm the Thursday evening before your scheduled bulk pickup day.
