Observed Holidays



Municipal Offices are closed on Monday, July 5th in Observance of Independence Day. We will reopen on Tuesday, July 6th at 8:30 a.m.

As we approach the **July 4th** holiday weekend, we wanted to send out a message to our residents in regards to fireworks. We encourage the residents of Eastampton Township to enjoy the holiday weekend in a responsible way while celebrating and spending time together. We understand that some will take it upon themselves to engage in setting off fireworks at their own residences.

We would like to remind everyone of **Township Ordinance 343-1**. *It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue or cause to be made or continued any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others within the limits of the Township.* Respectfully, **Title 21** (Explosives and Fireworks) of **New Jersey State Code**, specifically **21:2-6** *Dangerous fireworks prohibited*, states: *it shall be unlawful to manufacture, sell, transport, or use dangerous fireworks within the state. "Dangerous fireworks" include*:

• Toy torpedoes containing more than 5 grains of an explosive composition.

• Paper caps containing more than .35 grain of explosive composition.

• Firecrackers or salutes exceeding 5 inches in length or 3/4 inch in diameter.

• Cannons, canes, pistols or other devices designed for use otherwise than with paper caps.

• Any fireworks containing a compound or mixture of yellow or white phosphorous or mercury.

Any fireworks that contain a detonator or blasting cap.

• Fireworks compositions that ignite spontaneously or undergo marked decomposition when subjected for 48 consecutive hours to a temperature of 167 degrees Fahrenheit.

• Fireworks that can be exploded en masse by a blasting cap placed in one of the units or by impact of a rifle bullet or otherwise.

• Fireworks, such as fuses, containing a match tip, or head, or similar igniting point or surface, unless each individual tip, head or igniting point or surface is thoroughly covered and securely protected from accidental contact

or friction with any other surface.

• Fireworks containing an ammonium salt and a chlorate.

We ask that everyone please be considerate of your fellow neighbors and their animals. Many residents have young children and animals that may become anxious and frightened at the sound of fireworks. Please also remember that fireworks are dangerous explosive devices that can lead to severe injuries and even lead to death.

On behalf of the Township of Eastampton we wish you a happy and healthy 4th of July. Please enjoy it responsibly!

Resident Reminder: We need everyone's cooperation to help keep Eastampton neat and tidy. Please adhere to the schedule for your area for brush or bulk pick-up. Anything is to be placed out **only on the night before your scheduled pickup day**. Please note that as per Ordinance 2019-17 <u>no house clean outs</u> will be accepted for bulk pick-up by the Public Works department.

Ordinance 2019-17. 444-2 Section D.

The Township will collect bulk trash on a monthly basis. Bulk shall consist of items such as old furniture, bedding, carpeting, pool covers and metal items such as bicycles. No waste materials of any kind that are generated from commercial activities or businesses, including handyman, repair services, retail store, offices, real estate agencies, landlords, contractors, agricultural enterprises. Residents doing minor repairs to the primary residence may put out small amounts of debris on their bulk day. No house/rental clean outs will be accepted.

Concrete/cinder blocks, bricks and stone are considered construction debris and will not be accepted.

If a building permit was required for the work that generated waste then it is considered construction debris. Absolutely no contractors or landlords will be permitted to dispose of construction or demolition debris or household cleanouts.
