Trash Collection Reminder: Only household trash is to be placed in bags in the cart, and the lid should close. Branches and tree debris in carts **will not be collected** as it will jam the compactor causing it to malfunction.

Brush Collection: Brush chipping is done the first full week of every month, except when the first Monday is a holiday then collection will be done the following week. In the event of inclement weather, brush will be collected the following week as well. Please keep sidewalks and pathways clear for pedestrian and bicycle traffic. BRUSH RECYCLING SCHEDULE

Public Works will begin brush collection in April through November. The schedule may be modified at any time due to personnel; equipment and inclement weather.

- Every street will be collected only one time. Please be certain brush is out prior to 6:00 am. If brush has been collected on your street once, the Public Works Department cannot return to pick up brush put out late. Any brush placed curbside midweek will not be collected if your street has already been collected. Please do not place brush curbside more than one week prior to pickup.
- Brush should be no larger than (8) eight inches in diameter, and must be four (4) feet or longer.
- Brush should be piled curbside as not to block view or traffic with all cut ends facing the same direction. Because the brush will be fed into the chipper cut end first, all cut ends should be facing away from traffic, for ease of loading. If possible, this should be done the weekend prior to the collection date, to prevent piles from sitting for long periods of time at curbside.
- All vines, bamboo, and root balls must be removed.
- The Township will not collect large piles as a result of any large landscaping projects or commercially cut brush. Disposal must be provided by the contractor or removed at the homeowner's expense. This service is provided to assist resident's dispose of small amounts of brush and tree limbs.
- Brush resulting from lot clearing and/or tree removal by a contractor or done by the owner themselves shall be the responsibility of the property owner and shall not be collected by Public Works. Disposal must be provided by the contractor or removed at the homeowners expense.
- Small sticks, vines, and small shrubs can still be disposed of through regular trash collection, as long as they are tied in bundles weighing less than 50 pounds and are no longer than (3) three feet in length.

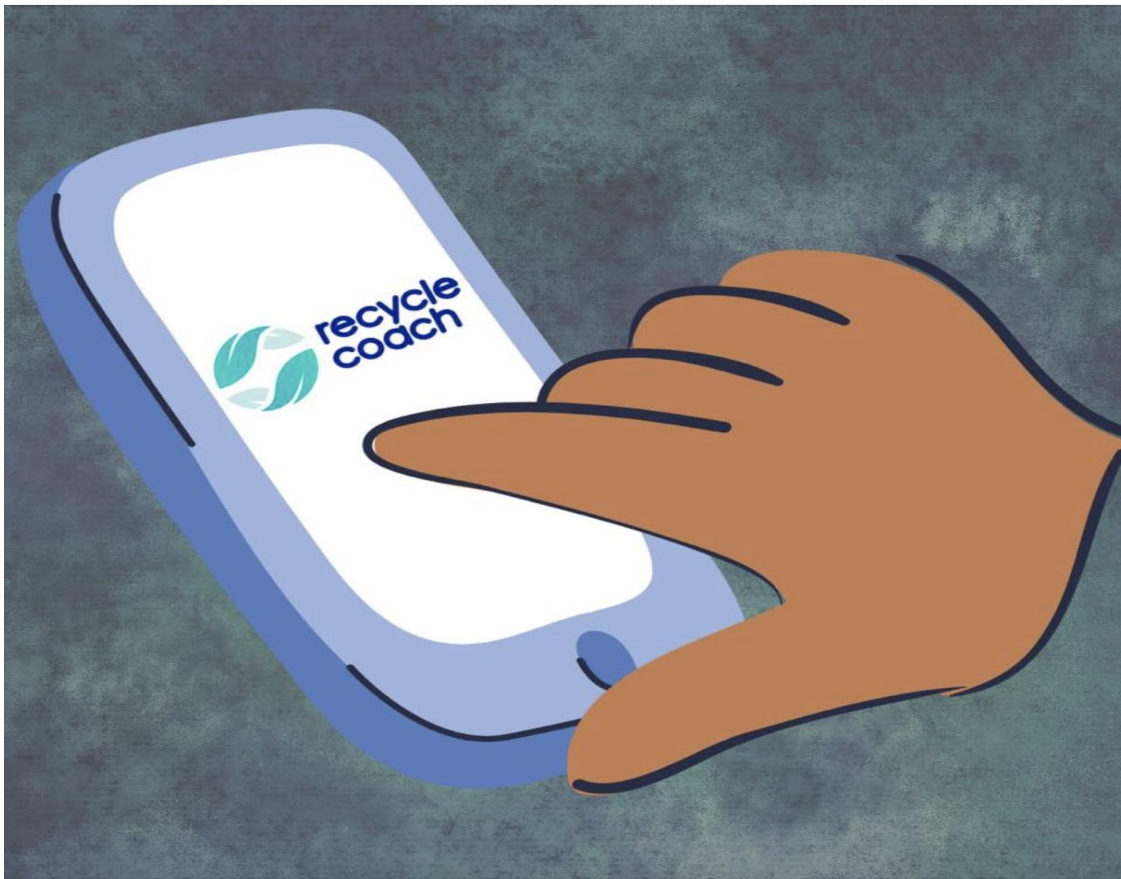

Single-Use Paper and Plastic Bags Ban

On November 4th, 2020, Governor Murphy signed S864, the nation's strictest single use plastics and paper ban. Beginning in May 2022, both plastic and paper single-use bags, as well as disposable food containers and cups made from polystyrene foam, will be banned statewide. This bill is a significant step to reduce harm and pollution that these products cause to our environment.
