





MEETING CORNER

VOTING CORNER

The last day to register to vote for the November 2nd General Election on Tuesday, November 2, 2021 is **Tuesday**, **October 12th**. Visit the NJ Voter Information Portal to check your registration status, or fill out your voter registration application online at NJ DOS - Division of Elections - Register to Vote! (state.nj.us).

New Jersey has passed legislation to make voting easier, through use of ballot drop boxes and early voting.



Ballot drop boxes. A ballot drop box is a secure, locked structure operated by election officials where voters may deliver their ballots from the time they receive them in the mail up to the time polls close at 8 pm on Election Day, November 2, 2021. There will be at least 10 drop boxes located throughout each county, which will be available 24 hours a day. A drop box has been installed in Eastampton at 12 Manor House Court, and additional Burlington County locations can be found at: NJ DOS - Division of Elections - Secure Ballot Drop Box Locations.

Early Voting. This new option allows registered voters to cast their ballot in person, using a voting machine,

during a nine-day period prior to Election Day. Every county will provide registered voters with this option for the 2021 General Election. They will designate in-person early voting locations that will be open Saturday, October 23 through Sunday, October 31. Hours will be Monday-Saturday, 10:00 a.m.—8:00 p.m. and Sunday, 10:00 a.m.—6:00 p.m. No appointment is necessary. Top 5 Things To Know About In-Person Early Voting

Earlier this year, a law was passed permitting in-person early voting in New Jersey. Here are the answers to five common questions about in-person early voting:

1. WHAT IS IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING?

This new option enables all registered voters to cast their ballot in person, using a voting machine, during a nine-day period prior to Election Day. You can now choose to vote, in person, when it's most convenient for your schedule.

2. WHERE CAN I ACCESS IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING?

- No matter where you live in the county, you can vote your specific ballot at any of your county's designated in-person early voting locations.
- Find your county's locations at Vote.NJ.Gov.

3. WHEN CAN I ACCESS IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING?

- In-person early voting locations will be open Saturday, October 23 through Sunday, October 31.
- Hours will be Monday-Saturday, 10:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. and Sunday, 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. No appointment necessary.

4. WHAT IF I ALWAYS VOTE BY MAIL, BUT NOW WANT TO VOTE EARLY, IN PERSON, INSTEAD?

- Check whether or not you are an active vote-by-mail voter at Vote.NJ.Gov, under "Am I Registered?"
- If you are registered to vote by mail in the 2021 General Election, you must opt out, in order to cast a ballot in person on a machine at an early voting location.
- To opt out, contact your County Clerk, listed below, by August 31.

5. CAN I STILL CHOOSE FROM OTHER VOTING OPTIONS?

Yes. You may select, instead, to:

- Apply for a vote-by-mail ballot and return it one of the following ways:
 - 1... Mail: It must be postmarked on or before 8:00 p.m. November 2 and be received by your county's Board of Elections on or before November 8.
 - 2... Secure Ballot Drop Box: Place it in one of your county's secure ballot drop boxes by 8:00 p.m. on November 2. Drop box locations can be found at Vote.NJ.Gov.
 - 3... Board of Elections Office: Deliver it in person to your county's Board of Elections Office by 8:00 p.m. on November 2. County Election Officials' contact information can be found at Vote.NJ.Gov.
- Or, vote in person at your polling place, from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, November 2. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities. Go to Vote.NJ.Gov for your polling place, listed on the Polling Locations page.

NOTE: Vote-by-mail ballots CANNOT be returned to your polling place for this election.



Dear Neighbor,

In the near future, Verizon will be bringing its technologically advanced fiber optic network to your neighborhood. As part of this effort, we will soon begin placing buried utility lines in your community that provide a fiber-to-the home/business connection. We are sending this notice to give you an idea of what to expect during this construction phase of the project.

First, different colored lines will be painted by utility companies that have facilities in the neighborhood. The lines will appear at various locations on the street, sidewalk and in the grassy areas around your community. This marking of facilities is necessary to identify buried utility lines in the area, as required by law, and is part of the normal construction process in New Jersey. These lines are not permanent; over time, they will fade. If you have a buried sprinkler system, "invisible" dog fence, and/or private landscaping lighting on your property, please contact us at 888-240-5752 or 1.888.268.7824

Next, a "door hanger" will be placed at your home to notify you prior to the day before construction is scheduled to begin. All of the work will be handled by Verizon authorized contractors and their vehicles will be clearly identified with a sign that reads "Verizon Authorized Contractor." All work will be done in the public right-of-way. The exact location of the public right-of-way in relation to your property was identified during the design phase of the project, and was verified through the permit approval process.

During construction, there is a possibility that some homeowners may see altered terrain in front of their homes but within the public right-of-way. Our goal is to complete this work quickly and with as little disruption as possible. We will restore altered terrain to as close to original condition as possible. However, the time needed for full restoration will depend on weather conditions. In the event any of our efforts cause you concern, you may contact us at the number above and we will address your concerns as quickly as possible.

Once our fiber optic network is available in your neighborhood, you will be notified of how to order FiOS® TV, FiOS® Internet and home phone service. With FiOS® you get:

Residents can rake them to the curb for collection. Leaves should be placed in the grass strip between the curb and sidewalk, not in the street. Leaves should not be placed near fire hydrants, sign posts, portable basketball hoops, or telephone poles. Leaves must be free of all trash, sticks, branches, vines, rocks, dirt, and debris.

Mixed material will not be collected. Please see the below for your scheduled collection day.
